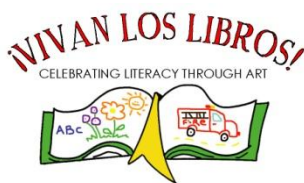
APPLICATION FOR 2009-2010 POET BOARD
